

Travel Checklist

Here's a generalized list of essential items for any international student moving abroad, regardless of their home country. This list covers various aspects like personal care, household items, documents, and more:

1. Documents

- Passport (with visa, if required)
- University admission letter
- Flight tickets and travel itinerary
- Accommodation confirmation
- Copies of essential documents (ID, birth certificate, academic records)
- Insurance (health, travel, etc.)
- Bank account details and local currency
- Emergency contact information
- Vaccination records (if required)

2. Clothing

- Weather-appropriate clothing (seasonal: warm coats, scarves, gloves, etc.)
- Casual wear (T-shirts, jeans, etc.)
- Formal wear (for presentations or formal events)
- Sleepwear
- Comfortable shoes, sandals, and slippers
- Traditional wear (for cultural events)
- Undergarments, socks, and thermal wear (for colder regions)

Preferable to purchase better Winter jackets after arriving in Germany. (Stores such as Primark provide affordable options)

3. Household Items

- **Kitchen essentials:** (Induction cooktop based cooking vessels)
- Basic utensils (plates, cups, cutlery)
- Cooking pots and pans
- Pressure cooker (optional but useful)

- Reusable water bottles
- Food storage containers (Tupperware)
- **Other household items:**
 - Hangers
 - Laundry bag
 - Small locks for bags or cupboards
 - Bedding (sheets, pillow covers, towels)
 - Universal travel adapters and power strips

Pans, plates and other common utensils can be purchased for affordable prices from local stores like Woolworth. (IKEA is also an option)

4. Electronics

- Laptop and accessories (charger, mouse)
- Mobile phone and charger
- External hard drive or USB drives
- Power bank
- Universal travel adaptor
- headphones/earphones
- Extension cords

5. Toiletries

- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Soap, shampoo, and conditioner
- Hair oil and comb
- Nail clippers, tweezers, and personal grooming kit
- Deodorant, moisturizer, and sunscreen
- First-aid kit (band-aids, antiseptic cream)
- Hand sanitizer and wipes
- Few rolls of toilet paper

6. Medicines

- Prescription medicines (with doctor's prescription)
- Over-the-counter medicines (painkillers, cold/flu medicine)
- Basic first-aid supplies (band-aids, antiseptic)

- Multivitamins and supplements

7. Stationery

- Notebooks, pens, and pencils
- Sticky notes, highlighters
- Stapler and paper clips
- Scientific calculator (if required for courses)
- Folders and files for organizing documents

8. Daily Essentials

- Detergent (for washing clothes)
- Iron (if required)
- Torch/flashlight
- Umbrella
- Masks and sanitizers (especially post-pandemic)

9. Personal Comfort Items

- Pillow (optional)
- Favorite snacks or non-perishable food from home
- Traditional spices or masalas (in small quantities)
- Thermal flask for hot drinks

*** (Supermarkets such as Aldi, Netto, Penny are a bit cheaper than Kaufland, Rewe, Edeka....but only by a few cents...the prices are almost the same everywhere. For Halal meat, you can visit Turkish stores such as, [Zafar](#) or [Erdemli](#))***
